### **Topic: Community Emergency Communications: An EHCMA Initiative (East Harris County Manufacturer Association)**

We know the chemical industry responds well to emergencies that happen inside their facilities' fence line, but they have done a poor job of communicating response actions to authorities who live outside their fence line. Mark W. Gaddy will provide an overview of how the chemical industry is working with community and local authorities to improve communications after a chemical plant emergency and offer an insightful look at the challenges the EHCMA faced as they improved their community communication capabilities.

Speaker: Mark W. Gaddy is plant manager of the Lyondell La Porte Complex. He has worked over 17 years for Lyondell in manufacturing, serving in various management positions at a variety of locations.
